## FROM THE VICAR

Dear Friends

There is an image in the Bedgebury Chapel in St Mary's at the moment. It's there for Lent, which runs from mid February to Easter Day, which this year falls on Sunday 5 April. The image is a copy of a painting by Stanley Spencer, who lived between 1891 and 1959. He is well known for his paintings of biblical scenes set, not in the Middle East, but in Cookham, the Berkshire village where Spencer was born and which he loved all his life. Setting these paintings in his own village was his way of making the stories they tell real again; a way of remembering that the great stories from the bible are not just distant history, but continue to be alive and to speak to us in the places where we live and work even today.

The painting in the chapel is called *Rising from Sleep* and is one of a series of paintings which depict Jesus out in the wilderness during the 40 days he spent there fasting and praying. Spencer originally intended to paint 40 of these paintings, one for each of the days Jesus was in the desert. In the end he only managed eighteen.

Each of the paintings show Jesus as part of the landscape around him. Spencer's Jesus is one with his surroundings, often emerging from the mountains or the desert floor, at home with the animals and the flowers.

*Rising from Sleep* shows Jesus with his hands clasped together pointing upwards towards the sky. This Jesus is totally focussed upwards towards God. He has just woken up and this is the first thing he does in the morning. His whole being is directed towards his Father. And as his arms point upwards, his robes billow out around him like the petals of a flower - it's as if his focus on God allows him to open up like a beautiful flower unfurling to greet the sun.



It is in the Bedgebury Chapel because this is also a place of prayer; a place where people have knelt and lifted their needs to God for many centuries. It is a holy space, a place in which prayers of every sort have soaked into the walls over the years.

It's always good to pray, but it's easy to forget that truth. Lent is a particularly good time to remember it again and to recommit to praying regularly. Perhaps some time this Lent you would like to spend some time in the Bedgebury Chapel, or somewhere else in Christ Church or St Mary's. Spend some time pointing yourself towards God, offering him whatever is on your mind or in your heart and see what blossoms in your life as a result.

The Church was full of candles, over 150 of them creating a warm welcoming atmosphere.

There was there was a feeling of peace and meditation with intercessions and bible readings.

The Singers lead the congregation in a dozen songs from Taizé and there were two periods of silence giving an opportunity for a peaceful focus on God.

This year we are repeating the experience with readings, prayers and songs covering the whole period of Easter; the 'Jubilation of Jesus entering Jerusalem' on Palm Sunday, the 'Despair of his Crucifixion' on Good Friday, through to the 'Joy of his Resurrection' on Easter Sunday.




## **PLANT SALE**

## **Surgery Closures**

## **Surgery Hours**

Patients are reminded that there is Open Surgery every morning between 08.30 and 10.00 (if you book within this time you will be seen) and on Fridays between 16.00 and 18.00 (ideally for patients unable to easily attend morning surgery and urgent cases that cannot wait until Monday).

Afternoon appointments on Mon-Thu are pre-booked and are NOT drop-in session (unless for an emergency).

## **Minor Injuries**

Drs. Watson & Pace ask that patients requiring urgent treatment for a minor injury during practice opening hours should, in the first instance, attend the Surgery where they will be seen by either a doctor or the Practice Nurse. This will lessen the workload on the extremely busy A&E departments of our local hospitals.

## **Friends and Family Questionnaire**

Please note that you may be asked complete a short 'Friends & Family' questionnaire when you visit the Old Parsonage Surgery. Participation in this NHS Scheme is compulsory for the Surgery and the data is used in judging practice performance but also provides useful local feedback to the Surgery team.

## **Electronic Access for Patients**

This facility is now fully functional and allows patients to order repeat prescriptions, book appointments on-line and you can now access your Medical Records to view your Medications and Allergies.

Please contact the Surgery if you wish to take advantage of this service.

## **Surgery Patient Fund**

The Surgery staff would like to express their gratitude for the generous donations to the above Fund. This has allowed the recent purchase of baby weighing scales, a paediatric Pulse Oximeter and new ECG equipment.

## **Redecoration of Practice Waiting Area**

Decoration to all areas of the Surgery (required to afford compliance with current NHS regulations) is now well under way. The redecoration of the waiting area, which will benefit all patients, will be scheduled for weekends. Patient access to the Surgery or to Practice staff will not be affected.

## VILLAGE ECHOES



Just inside the main body of St Mary's Church, on the west wall, is a bronze tablet erected in January 1904 as a tribute from his fellow officers to the memory of John Gordon Stirling DSO, a Lieutenant in the 9th Lancers, who died at Sialkote in the Punjab region of India (now in Pakistan) on 22nd May 1902. Newspaper reports of his death record that it was as a result of an

accident but give no further details.

Stirling, who had been born in London in 1874, was the second son of Lord Justice, Sir James Stirling, whose family had used Finchcocks as their country residence since about 1890. He seemed destined for a military career having joined the Militia at a young age before joining the 9th Lancers in the summer of 1895, and he was promoted to Lieutenant a year later in July 1896. His subsequent army career took him to South Africa where he served with distinction in the Anglo-Boer War, being twice mentioned in despatches in 1901 by both Field Marshal Lord Roberts and Lord Kitchener. Kitchener's despatch concerned his gallant conduct at Twyfontein, Orange River Colony, on 27th May "for his coolness in action and for returning to fetch a dismounted man". The despatch also noted that he had lost one arm and been wounded in the other during the campaign. It was for this service that he was awarded the Distinguished Service Order, although he had sadly died before the award became known. The insignia and warrant were sent to his father. The newspapers also reported that he had been severely wounded in actions at Belmont and Enslin in 1899. At time of his death he was Adjutant to the 9th Lancers.

His father, Sir James Stirling, was born in Aberdeen in 1836. After graduating from the University of Aberdeen and then Trinity College, Cambridge he became a member of Lincolns Inn where he was called to the bar in 1862. In 1886 he became a judge in the Court of Chancery and received his knighthood. After a distinguished legal career he retired in June 1906 to his home in Goudhurst. Apart from the law, he took an active interest in science and held the position of vice-president of the Royal Society between 1909 and 1910. Sir James died, aged 81, at Finchcocks on 27th June 1916 after a short illness. His widow, Elizabeth, survived him by two years and was buried with him in the Victorian Cemetery in Back Lane, on 18th June 1918.

## GOUDHURST PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Your Parish Council has started 2015 with a flourish of activity on many fronts. New contracts are being entered into for the better maintenance, weed control and mowing of the Chequer Playing Field and the Lurkins Rise Play Area. Council is investigating the waterlogging and ineffective drainage at the south end of the Chequer field which has occasionally rendered it unplayable. The Public Address system with its variety of uses including the Village Hall and the Village Fete, is being renovated to improve it and extend its life. Various proposals to improve traffic flow, safety etc. have been prepared by our Highways and Footpaths Committee and submitted to Kent Highways for costing. We await their response. Suggestions have been made for the community to restart the community Speed Watch which was successful some years ago, together with the possible purchase of a movable reactive speed sign. Speed Watch Volunteers please contact the Clerk.

After an apparently interminable period of hibernation the representative of the Diocese has at last responded to our various attempts to move forward with the lease of the Glebe field for the benefit of the community. We are now promised a draft lease and will hopefully have something positive to report (this year we hope!). Meanwhile, the Council has agreed to take a lease from St Mary's PCC of the playground area outside the Church Rooms on Back Lane; this will ensure clarity of responsibility and fulfil the Council's responsibility to the community. Negotiations, as previously reported are underway to take ownership of the Balcombes Hill Car Park and public conveniences. Solicitors are preparing documents so that the outstanding matters relating to the ownership of the Quarry Centre in Kilndown can be finally resolved.

Julie Chapman our local co-ordinator for Kent Youth visited Council to brief us on the various activities and projects being undertaken by the young people in Goudhurst & Kilndown, for which awards have been won. Well done and we look forward to reading more about their activities separately. This is an excellent KCC initiative and GPC has agreed to fund the use of the Church Rooms by the Youth Group for the next six months. This is so that their funds can be used for project activity including their participation in the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme. Volunteers to help are welcome. We also welcomed PCSO Dave Jenkins our new Police Support Officer who has replace Laura Carey. Dave Jenkins' number is 07969 584279 or call 101 and ask to speak to him.

"Goudhurst in Bloom" the 2015 competition is approaching with classes for local residents' front gardens, Pubs & Restaurants and our shops. As noted in the February GPC News Cllr Angela Broom has agreed to organise the competition again and she can be contacted for information and application details on [angelathebroom@aol.com](mailto:angelathebroom@aol.com). So get your application in or tip off Angela with the names of great gardens that she should approach.

Over twenty five local residents filled the Jessel Room for a recent meeting of the GPC Planning Committee and contributed their views on the proposed mixed development of some 21/23 "retirement" flats and houses on the site just below the Old Parsonage. Opposition was expressed highlighting two major issues

- a) that the proposed development did not seem to match up to the retirement home designation having no warden provision etc. This is important because the site, being outside Goudhurst's build development limit, can only be built on for a limited range of needs; retirement facilities being one of them and
- b) the quality of the proposed development itself, the evident severe lack of adequate parking spaces, the inappropriate design of the proposed buildings and a general lack of information that might allow a considered judgement. For these and other reasons it was considered that the proposal could not be supported.

HMP Blantyre House is to be renovated, closed or mothballed. Who knows which? And whoever knows is not telling us, or our MP Greg Clark or apparently the Minister responsible. On the 11th of February the governor held a meeting at Blantyre with local residents. From his stated limited knowledge of the reasons behind the decision he did his best to reassure the community. No one from the Ministry attended to throw more light on future thinking so the result was inconclusive and destabilising for the community. The neighbouring community reiterated its support for Blantyre which has been an institution in our midst for many years being proud of their success in re-integrating prisoners into society. It would be a great loss to society if that skilled and dedicated prison team was dispersed and lost; and when lost not so easily reassembled. Meanwhile, there is uncertainty and concern as to the future use of the buildings and site. GPC will continue to press for better information and keep the community informed.

There will be a Parish Council election on 7th May. All 12 seats on the Council will be up for election (8 for Goudhurst Ward, 3 for Kilndown and 1 for Curtisden Green). Four councillors will not be seeking re-election after many years' service, so we will need four new candidates to replace them so more than that number will trigger an election. 
